History

he City Campus was founded in 2005. It aimed to create an environment where older students (Y8 - Y13) from the international community could immerse themselves into the local culture of Beijing whilst studying a British curriculum.

Harrow Beijing moved into the purpose-built state-of-the-art Hegezhuang Campus in April 2013, as the school had developed into an "all-through school" (EY - Y13) which focused on educating students of all nationalities to take ownership of their progress from the Lower School through to the Upper School.

The City Campus has now been re-designed and transformed into a dedicated world-class campus for young pupils.











Facilities

he City Campus facilities include a fully kitted out Sports Hall and Dining Room, as well as a wide range of play-based creative spaces including a Maker Space, Construction Zone, Dance Studio, Visual Arts Studio and Music and Drama Studio. There is a Playground and Sports Pitch which has been designed to support the young pupils' physical development.

Teaching Staff

ur City Campus teachers are highly motivated professionals in Early Childhood Education. They strive to develop the students' individual strengths and talents. The teaching staff are led by the Head of Early Years, Dr. Tina Stephenson. Dr Stephenson graduated from the University of Western Ontario with a Doctorate in Education Leadership (International Education).





Curriculum

he City Campus enrols pupils from 3 - 6 years old and follows the excellent, broad and balanced Harrow Beijing curriculum that is purposefully designed to enrich and complement a British Education with study of the culture, history and language of China.

The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) at Harrow Beijing encourages students to be happy, independent and motivated leaders in their school environment.

Teachers plan for purposeful, play-based learning using the Harrow Early Years learning framework whilst also taking into consideration the individual needs of all of our learners.

A strong focus in the Early Years is on Social and Emotional development alongside key areas in Literacy and Mathematics including Phonics development. Daily classroom activities are supplemented with lessons in specialist subjects of Physical Education, Music, Drama, Visual Arts and Mandarin.

As the children grow older, they continue to develop essential Literacy and Mathematics skills, while a great emphasis is placed on the enjoyment of books and the teaching of reading, writing, speaking, and listening. They also continue with their specialist lessons in PE, Music and Mandarin.



Extra-Curricular Programmes



he City Campus provides the pupils with an extensive variety of extra-curricular activities through Harrow's Leadership and Service Programme. Clubs including, but not limited to, Football, Ballet, LAMDA, Cultural and Community activities are provided after school for older pupils.


